






he all-new second generation Rolls-Royce Ghost was launched last year and in a major departure, unlike its predecessor, was based not on the BMW 7-Series, but instead shared its platform with in-house siblings the flagship Phantom and the Cullinan luxury SUV. Admittedly, like those other Rolls-Royce motor cars, its power unit is from BMW (which owns Rolls-Royce), though it's no less than a V12 engine with a 6.75-litre cubic capacity.

This then is the Black Badge edition of said Ghost. And as such, it gets about 30bhp more than the regular car, taking power output up to nearly 600bhp along with 900Nm of torque. Don't be so crass as to ask performance figures of this majestic machine, but if you would kindly keep it to yourselves, I can inform you've I've heard whispers of 0-62mph acceleration in 4.5 seconds and the top speed is limited to 155mph. 




t is this time of year that most of all dread – Winter. Days are getting shorter and darker; nights are getting longer and typical unpredictable bad British weather awaits us. So let's see what we can do to get our cars ready for winter; spending some time now getting our cars ready could save us the heartache of a breakdown; being stranded on the side of the road on a freezing cold, rainy, or worst still – a snowy winter day.

Check Under Bonnet

Check your engine oil, brake fluid, power steering fluid, automatic transmission fluid, coolant and top up if needed, test the strength of your coolant antifreeze with a tester so you know that your engine and radiator will be protected when the temperature drops. Add 'winter screen wash' to your washer bottle as it has a much lower freezing point. Test your windscreen washer to ensure the jets are all working and spraying the windscreen evenly. Use an adjustment tool if any one of the jets is not reaching the glass sufficiently. Check the rear wash wipe works properly if you have one. If your car has headlamp washers, ensure they are working also. Check the condition of your air filter and replace if clogged. If you have a high-performance reusable air filter, check it and clean if necessary as we mentioned in last month's issue. Whist you are there look at the condition of your battery, if the terminals are corroded this is a good time to replace your battery. A fully charged battery should read 12.6 volts or above. When the engine is running, that number should be between 13.7 and 14.7 volts. Anything lower than 12.2 volts means you have a bad battery. You can check your battery voltage with a multi-meter. Also check the condition of the battery leads. Finally, check the condition of all the rubber hoses and belts, including the radiator hoses. If you have a modern diesel, make sure your 'AdBlue' tank is topped up.



Check Bulbs

Check all exterior bulbs are working including your fog lamps. If you have halogen bulbs, consider upgrading to brighter high-performance versions such as 'Osram Nightbreakers.' Check the condition of all light clusters.

Check Rubbers and Locks

Check condition of your wiper blades and all rubber door and boot seals. Spray silicone spray on rubber seals to prevent doors from freezing shut in cold temperatures. Clear all leaves and debris in boot, bonnet, and door shut lines. Ensure all water drainage channels are cleaned. Check the condition of your tyres. Check the pressures and tread depths are good. Consider switching to winter tyres. Don't forget to check your spare tyre. Look at the condition of your brake discs, pads and callipers. Check all your exterior locks are working. If your electronic key fob dies for whatever reason, then you will still be able to get into your car. Spray a small amount of WD40 into locks to ensure they are operating smoothly.

Wash and Wax

Give the bodywork a thorough rinse, pay attention to wheel arches. If your pressure washer has a under chassis adaptor jet, use it. Use snow foam and a good quality shampoo in a bucket of warm water and a microfiber mitt. Use a filter grate in your bucket to catch grit and keep it at the bottom of your bucket. Rinse the shampoo off and don't forget to clean your wheels with a suitable alloy wheel cleaner. Use a large microfiber drying towel to dry your vehicle. Use a wax with carnauba to protect the entire body. This will help repel rain and dirt and keep your car looking cleaner for longer during the winter months.

Glass Care and Interior

Use a quality glass cleaner and micro fibre cloth to clean all your exterior glass including your wing mirrors. From the inside, use another clean micro-fibre cloth to clean all glass including your rear-view mirror and sunroof glass. Vacuum all seats, carpets and mats including those in your boot. If you have a leather interior, clean the leather with a suitable leather cleaner then apply some leather cream. Install heavy duty rubber floor mats to protect your interior throughout winter.

Be Prenared

Kit your boot with an ice scraper and de-icer spray. Carrying a warning triangle and hi-vis jacket is also a good idea in the event of a breakdown. Make sure you have a bright torch plus extra batteries. A mobile phone charger, power bank, jump leads or battery booster is also a must. If the weather gets icy and snowy, keep a folding shovel in your boot. Make sure your First aid kit is up to date and pack it with any spare prescription medication. Also keep emergency food and water. Winter gloves, hat, coat, warm clothes, and a blanket could also be a lifesaver. Store hand sanitizer/ wet wipes and spare masks in your glove box in easy reach. Finally ensure your breakdown cover is up to date and the breakdown number is stored in your phone or make sure you have downloaded the emergency breakdown app.


Prepare Yourself

The new government legislation was an epochdefining watershed, effectively ending centuries of horse drawn transport and giving motorists the

freedom of the road.

To mark the momentous occasion, more than 320 pioneering 'horseless carriages' from the dawn of motoring will leave Hyde Park in London at sunrise (07:06am) on Sunday morning and make the same 60-mile journey as those prophetic early motorists had done 125 years earlier from the capital city to the resort town of Brighton on the Sussex coast.





- New Ford-commissioned study reveals 91% of Brits feel a personal level of responsibility in the fight against climate change



Alliance of British Drivers Driving Sense 'Global Climate Crisis' Fact Check

Antarctica: No warming for the past 70 years (3) and the past 6 months have been the coldest on record (4). Sea ice extent is still above the 1985 level (1).

Global Burning and Wildfires: The share of land burned globally has declined from 4.2% in 1900 to 2.5% in 2021. In California wildfires burned 12% of the state before 1800 and 4.2% in 2020 (5). The key human causes of wildfires remains deliberate arson, accidental fires and poor forest management.

Global Weather Losses: As a precentage of GDP, weather losses show a declining trend since 1990 (6).

Hurricanes: There's no upward trend in USA landfalling hurricanes since 1900, or total global hurricane energy since 1980 (6). **Tornadoes:** There's a declining trend for tornadoes since the 1950s including strong and violent tornadoes with 166mph wind speeds or over (6). **Sea Level Rise:** A paper published in Nature Climate Change in 2016 showed that the Earth's surface gained 115.000 SqKm of water and 173,000 SqKm of land over 30 years, including 20,135 SqKm of water and 33,700 SqKm of land in coastal areas (7). Also, pacific atoll Tuvalu has experienced an increase in land area over 2.9%. In fact 74% of islands in the pacific atoll group are larger now than they were 40 years ago (8).

Death Rates and Economic Damage: Climate-related deaths are down 80 – 90% during the past four decades, from flood, flash flood, coastal flood, cold, heatwaves and wind (2019 study published in Global and Environmental Change) (9). There are 10 times as many deaths from cold compared to heat. Since 1920 the climate-related death risk has fallen from 250 per 1 million people to 1 per 1 million in 2020 (Bjorn Lomborg) (10).

Global Crop Yields: Since the 1960s yields of maize, oats, wheat, rice and barley have increased signifcantly (Our World in Data) (11), no doubt helped by the greening of the Earth thanks to increased levels of atmospheric CO2 (Nature Climate Change/NASA 2016) (12). **Carbon Dioxide v Temperature in the 20th/21st Century:** During 1910 to 1945 the global average temperature increased by 0.4C, but was accompanied by only a 10 parts per million (ppm) increase in atmospheric CO2, and the temperature in the Arctic increased by 1.6C. Little or no warming occurred after 1945 until 1980 to 2018, when there was another 0.4C increase accompanied by a 97ppm rise in atmospheric CO2 – either CO2 was 10 times more powerful during 1910 to 1945, or the warming was mostly natural. Half of the 21st century temperature increase so far is due to the natural phenomenon know as El Nino.

Methane: One of the many bizarre claims being emitted by COP26 is that methane (CH4) is responsible for 50% of warming and we should stop eating meat/dairy products. Given that the level of methane in the atmosphere is around a tiny 0.00018%, it is therefore out-competed by much higher levels of the greenhouses gases CO2 (0.0417%) and water vapour (up to 4%) for absorption of infrared radiation, methane is largely irrelevant.

Implausible Climate Model Scenarios: After years of misuse, the UN IPCC's latest AR6 report finally declared model scenario RCP8.5 as having a 'low likelihood.' However, this hasn't stopped alarmist scientists using these scenarios to predict implausible outcomes for future climate, which are being publicised in the media for scaremongering purposes. If anyone knows what the global climate crisis or emergency is, then please let us know without relying on computer model predictions. The demonisation of carbon dioxide (CO2) is suicidal given the fact that at the end of the last glaciation atmospheric CO2 at 180ppm was dangerously close the threshhold for the survival of plant life on Earth. Despite ignorant politicans like Boris Johnson attacking the industrial revolution, which was the UK's greatest ever gift to itself and the world, the world is a richer and healthier place. Prior to the industrial revolution UK life expectancy from birth was little more than 35 years. The two main problems that need to be solved in the world are poverty and a lack of access to electricity. These problems won't be solved by the premature abandonment of oil, gas and coal.


UK Motorists Fleeced of nearly £6m at pumps

The commercial heartbeat of UK Plc, fuelled almost entirely by diesel is in particular, being fleeced at will. Driving up inflation and impacting negatively on our post covid economic recovery."

- "For decades the fuel supply chain, notably a few wholesalers have ripped off drivers at will. But 2021 is year of the most immoral fuel pump profiteering seen in recent years. The smaller independent garages are subject to their pricing blackmail too, in what they are forced to pay. Their wholesalers hold them hostage to their bulk supply and what they can charge motorists at the pumps. These businesses consciously hold back wholesale price falls and ramp up bulk supply costs when oil prices rise, amounting to billions of manipulative changes to fill their already gold lined pockets."
- "Again we call on the Government to create an Independent Pricing Watchdog called PumpWatch. If gas, electricity, water and telecoms get price protection bodies, why shouldn't motorists have one too? We need 'PumpWatch' now, to ensure pricing fairness for both consumers and hardworking fuel retailers too. Most of the profiteering is at wholesale level not by small independent retailers, who are victims of the greedy fuel supply chain."
- "When oil prices rise and fall, millions of drivers have absolutely no idea what subsequently, they will pay at the pumps each time they fill up their vehicles. It is never ever the same price! There is no consistency, logic or clarity to the way pump prices are calculated. It remains a closely guarded secret in the fuel supply chain. PumpWatch is way overdue!"

58% of Brits polled, who expressed a preference, want a carbon Net Zero referendum, according to a YouGov/CAR26.Org survey.

YouGov/CAR26.org asked: 'To what extent do you support or oppose holding a national referendum to decide whether or not the UK pursues a Net Zero Carbon policy?'

From a sample of 1,648 adults surveyed between 22nd and 24th October 2021 weighted for demographics, then broken down by political allegiance, EU referendum voting, gender, age, social grade and region, 28% did not know whether they wanted a referendum on Carbon Net-Zero.

Only 30% of Brits surveyed did not want a referendum. This is made up of 15% being strongly opposed and 15% tending to oppose.

Meanwhile, 42% stated that they supported a carbon Net Zero Referendum, 20% of whom strongly supported and 22% tended to support a referendum. Of those that expressed a preference, over 50% want a referendum in every single category of those polled - including young people, Remainers and Londoners.

This follows calls from the Daily Telegraph last week publishing the first call for a referendum on Net-Zero. They said: "The green challenge is too important, its implications too dramatic, to be left to an establishment that has embraced net-zero as if it were a new religion."

CAR26.Org launched Tues, 26th Oct 2021 in advance of the COP26 United Nations Climate Change Conference, which commences on the 31st October 2021 from Glasgow.

According to CAR26.Org director, Lois Perry: "A majority of those expressing an opinion supported holding a referendum greater than the winning sides in either the Scottish Independence or Brexit referendums."

CAR26.Org believes that with greater transparency and objectivity on the science and costs, support for the Referendum would be even greater.

It proposes this vote be held at the 2024 or 2029 General Election.

Miss Perry, says: "We must not let political consensus drive us into carbon poverty. Let the people take control of the wheel."

"This poll reveals an arrogant remote elite charging ahead in pursuit of costly and futile carbon policy without looking over their shoulders at everyday Brits paying the price."

"Ordinary people know Government debt means future taxes and inflation."

According to the Institute for Fiscal Studies, the costs of Net Zero are more than £1,000 billion.

Miss Perry continues: "Support for a carbon Net Zero referendum is across the board in every category, and relative support of the 'Red Wall' North region for a referendum was the highest at 66% (excluding Don't Knows)."

"There is serious doubt that CO2 has a significant negative impact on the climate, and the annual increase in Chinese emissions equals the UK total."


"If CO2 is not the 'climate control knob' then far cheaper measures can handle weather events and slow long term climate change."

"With so much fiscally at stake, the poorest will be hit the hardest," she says.


"The Government has a duty to come clean about the pros and cons and the likely costs. We demand to be fully informed and then to have our say."

"Until then we demand a pause in their War on CO2 and that citizens can choose to opt out of misguided carbon costs and taxes," she says.

The Tony Blair Institute for Global Change quoted a May 2021 survey from the UK Government Department for Business Energy & Industrial Strategy which found that only a tiny 14% knew 'a lot' or even 'a fair amount' about Net-Zero.








